EXPLANATION: We are genuinely sorry that the October Letter reached many of you too late to be of use before the election. Cause: an unfortunate breakdown in our volunteer service. Remedy: more volunteer workers, or more money, or both. Will you help?

ELECTION: The campaign is over. Although there was little or no realistic discussion of the subject, peace was recognized as a national issue. That is a distinct gain. The President said in his Madison Square Garden address on the eve of election: "I hate war!" - "I know that the American people hate war!" That is good as far as it goes. It is now up to the peacemakers of the country to see that his administration acts as if it hated war. Will you help?

DISCUSSION GROUPS: Two lively study groups are now in progress; one in the Euclid Avenue neighborhood, the other at King Ferry. Both leaders are members of the University Faculty. Who will start the next?

AFTER ARMISTICE



E.P.C. SPEAKERS: Within the past six weeks four different men have presented the peace message to Syracuse audiences totaling nearly 6000 people. These have included high school and college students; workers, teachers, ministers; Protestant and Jewish groups. Plans are now under way to bring a

prominent Catholic peace leader to the city.

INCREASES: There are increasing evidences of the worth-whileness of our program; there are increasing opportunities for us to serve; but these demand ~~and are dependent upon increasing financial support.~~ Have you done your bit?
